UN Environment - **Africa Geothermal Inventory Database** (AGID) is an information sharing platform for geothermal related information in the East African Rift Region.

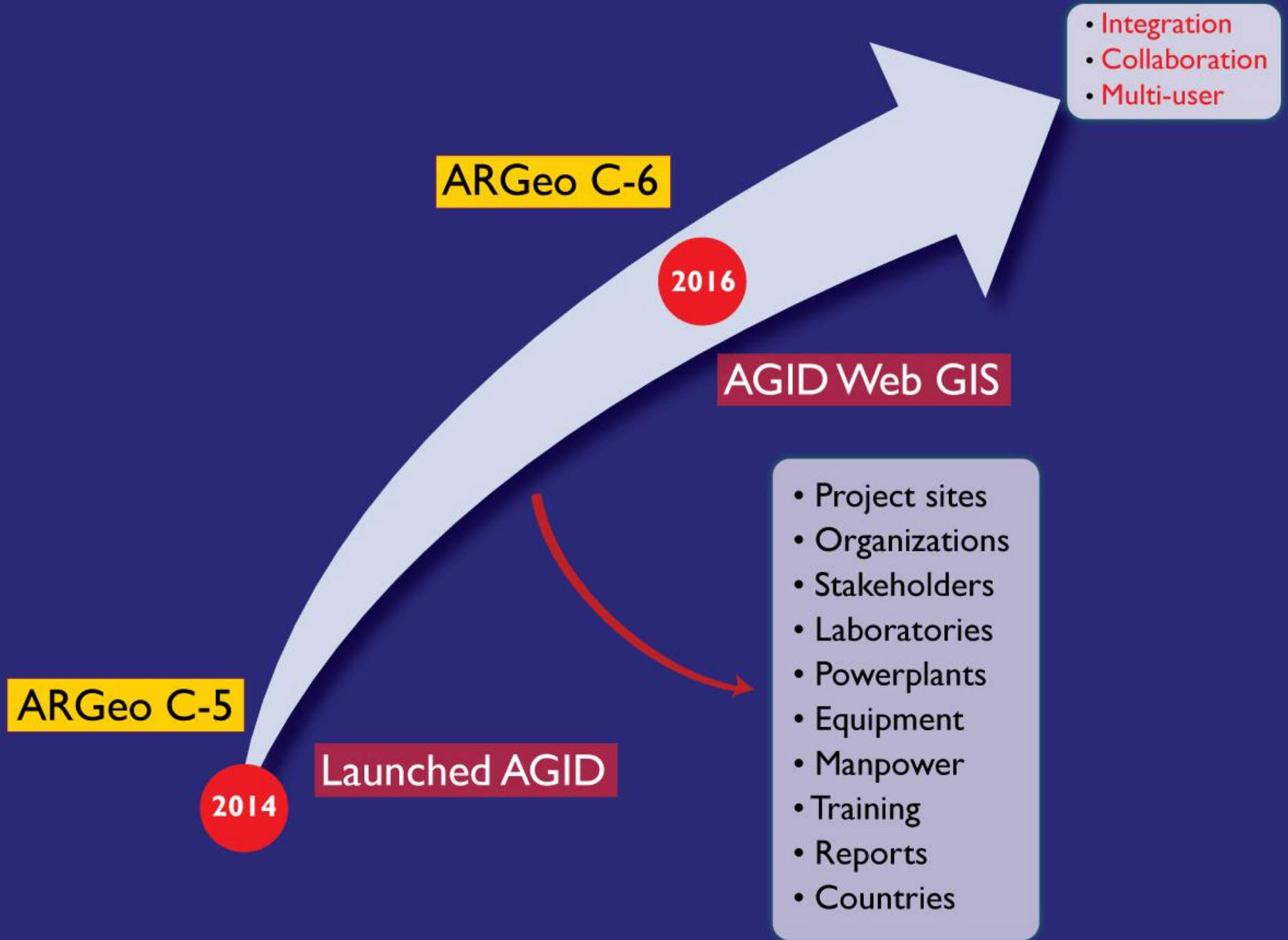
It aims at **promoting the exploration, development and utilization** of geothermal energy resources by **storing, compiling, and integrating** geothermal related information in the region and sharing it with end users



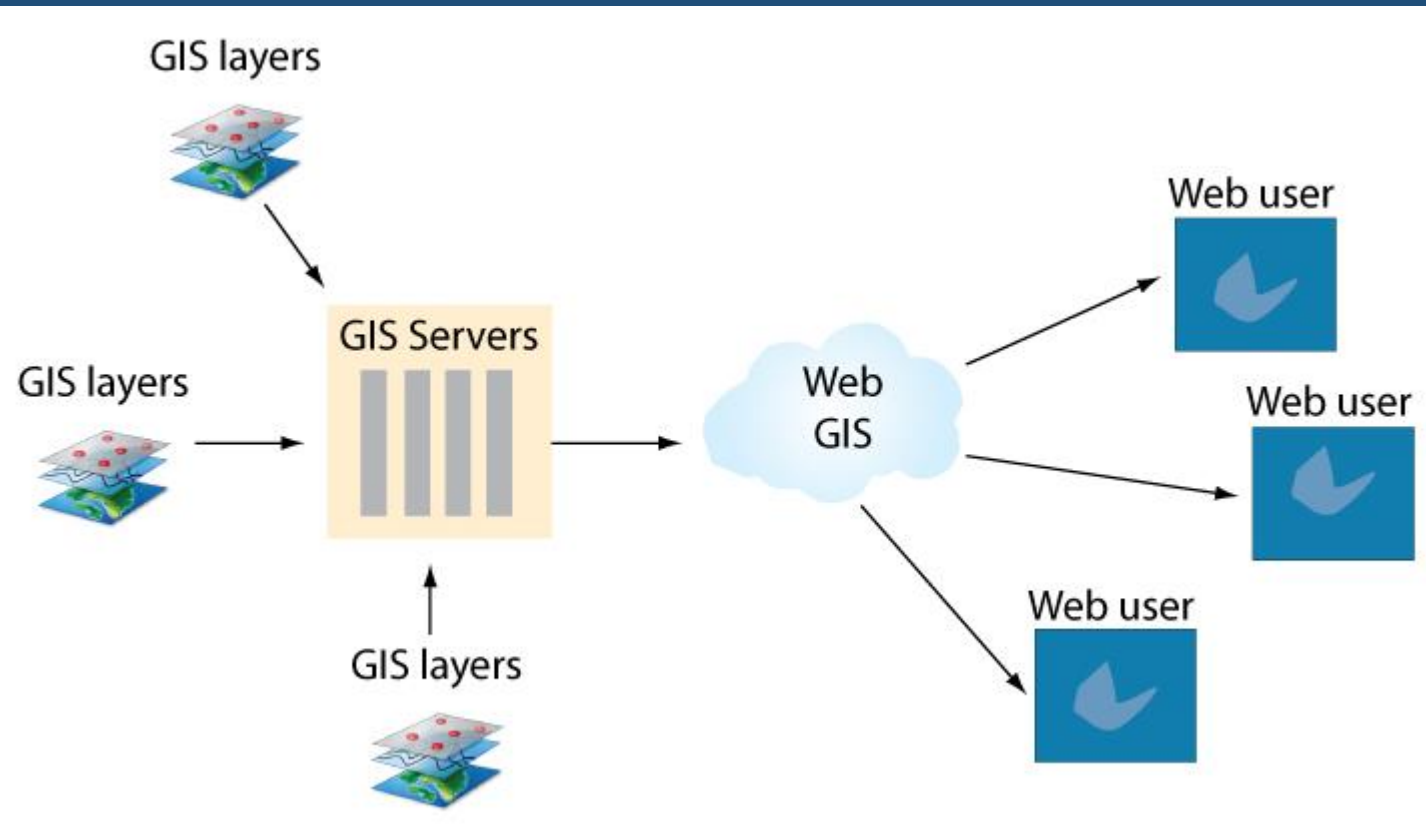
